



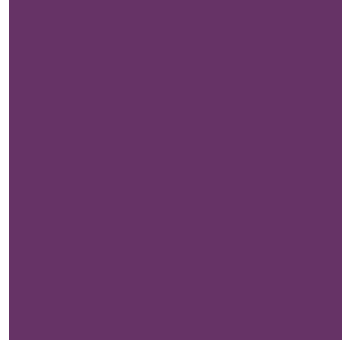
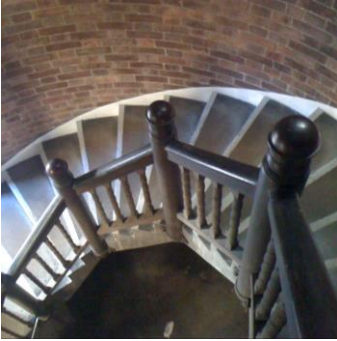

The Social Justice Table is returning for the year on Sunday March 3rd at morning tea, following the 9.30 service.

At this time of the year, our SJ Table donations support The Smith Family as children in their care are returning to school.

'The Smith Family is a children's charity helping disadvantaged Australian children to get the most out of their education, so they can create better futures for themselves.'

As the cost of living continues to climb, children experiencing disadvantage need support now more than ever. One in six Australian children and young people are growing up in poverty, where even the bare necessities are hard to come by. In a family where there is no regular income, money goes on food, rent and bills. Finding money for a school uniform, proper shoes, textbooks or the next school excursion is often impossible. Poverty at home can have a devastating impact on a child's learning and self-esteem, so our contributions can assist with purchase of books and learning materials which can help children to thrive at school.

Pastoral Partners @SaintAndrews

Over the past year Elders, Church Council and the Minister have been considering the best way to provide pastoral care to members of the congregation. As a result of these conversations, it has been decided to introduce the **Pastoral Partner Program**.

The **Pastoral Partner Program** aims to 'provide inclusive, low-key caring support to every member of the congregation'.

The Program notes state that 'with a ratio of one Pastoral Partner to five families, it is not long before the whole congregation develops an ethos of pastoral care'.

Pastoral Partners will be dedicated during the service on Sunday 11 February.

Learning for Living: First semester, 2024 – offered by Zoom only Thursday evenings 7:00-9:15pm

Talking about God (TAG 1): Exploring the Apostles' Creed

Description:

This course is the ideal introduction for those who are new to Christian theology.

The central ideas and beliefs, key debates, significant historical documents and leading thinkers of Christianity are introduced using the framework of the Apostles' Creed. The central ideas of both traditional and contemporary theology are explored with reference to Faith, God, Creation, Jesus and Salvation. While all major Christian denominations are considered there will be an emphasis on the UCA Basis of Union.

The classes will be structured to provide an opportunity for participants to engage in theological reflection appropriate to their own contexts and at their own pace. There are ten Learning Activity sessions as well as two tutorial sessions. One of the four Presbytery Lay Preacher CEM workshops is also included in the semester. There are breaks for the Easter/School holiday period – to allow time for further reading/reflection and preparation of assessment - See Learning Activities page for details.

This is a general interest course suitable for all those wanting to explore their faith further as well as for those wishing to undertake Lay preacher accreditation or considering a Period of Discernment.
