The sign of Immanuel

7:10Again the LORD spoke to Ahaz, saying,

7:11"Ask a sign of the LORD your God; let it be deep as Sheol or high as heaven."

7:12But Ahaz said, "I will not ask, and I will not put the LORD to the test."

7:13Then Isaiah said, "Hear then, O house of David! Is it too little for you to weary mortals that you weary my God also?

7:14Therefore the Lord himself will give you a sign. Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel.

7:15He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good.

7:16For before the child knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good, the land before whose two kings you are in dread will be deserted.

80:1Give ear, O Shepherd of Israel, you who lead Joseph like a flock! You who are enthroned upon the cherubim, shine forth

80:2before Ephraim and Benjamin and Manasseh. Stir up your might, and come to save us!

80:3Restore us, O God; let your face shine, that we may be saved.

80:40 LORD God of hosts, how long will you be angry with your people's prayers?

80:5You have fed them with the bread of tears and given them tears to drink in full measure.

Romans 1:1-7

Paul's greeting to the church at Rome

1:1Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God,

1:2which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures,

1:3the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh

1:4and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord,

1:5through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the gentiles for the sake of his name.

1:6including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,

1:7To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Matthew 1:18-25

Our God near at hand

1:18Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit.

1:19Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly.

1:20But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit.

1:21She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins."

1:22All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

1:23"Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us."

1:24When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife,

1:25but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.
